From The MGR Office...

We are at the end of the year, and I would like to thank everyone who has helped MGR through the show season and to all of our MGR breeders. We are looking forward to the 2023 show season, and MGR will have some shows posted after the beginning of the year on the website. We are very excited to start the new show season. In this newsletter, we will be talking about characteristics of a Myotonic goat. During the summer, we talked about the head of the myotonic goat. For this winter, we will be talking about the back, loin, rump and the tail. On the MGR judge's scorecard, a correct back should not have obvious dips. The back of a myotonic goat for does, wethers, and bucks should flow straight, level, thick, wide and muscular. The loin should be wide and thick with muscle. The rump is strong, wide, slightly angled, from the hips to the pins. Around the hips of the goat should be muscular and muscular down toward the pins. The tail should be attached straight out and be moveable in all directions.

Correct



This myotonic doe has a back that is straight through out and ties with her hips and loin.

Correct



Both of these does exhibit great breeder character.

Incorrect



This myotonic doe has a clear dip in her back. Her back is not level and she lacks muscle. She also demonstrates other breed characteristics.

This myotonic goat has a defined swayed back.

Sanctioned Show Rules Update

During the late fall and winter months each year, the MGR Show Committee reviews and discusses any changes that need to be made to the MGR Scorecards and Sanctioned Show Rules. Throughout the year, we keep notes on things that went well or didn't go so well for Show Hosts/Secretaries and Exhibitors. We look at these things to see if there are ways we as a Committee can make changes to provide a better experience for the Show Hosts/Secretaries and Exhibitors. We also review suggested changes brought forth by the MGR BOD and Ownership. Effective January 1, 2023, several changes were made to the MGR Sanctioned Show Rules and these are noted below. The entire Sanctioned Show Rules document can be found under the "Shows" tab of the MGR website.

Rule A3.

The sanction fee for the Buck and Doe shows are Fifty-five dollars (\$55) each per show. Effective 1/1/2023, the sanction fee for the Platinum Wether shows are Thirty-five dollars (\$35) per show. The sanction fee for the Market Wether shows are Twenty dollars (\$20) per show. The application for sanction must be postmarked to MGR at least 60 days prior to the show. The fees cover MGR rosettes for Junior, Senior and Grand Champion and Reserve Junior, Reserve Senior and Reserve Grand Champions. Late sanction fees of One hundred ten dollars (\$110) each for Buck and Doe shows, Seventy dollars (\$70) for Platinum Wethers and Forty dollars (\$40) for Market Wethers and are charged when applications are postmarked to MGR within 30 and 59 days of show date. This late fee covers the extra expense incurred to rush order sanction ribbons and to expedite the mailing of those ribbons. No sanctions will be approved with postmarks to MGR of 29 days or less from show date.

Rule B3g.

Exhibitor shall exhibit their goat in the show ring using collars with leads to maintain control. Effective 1/1/2023, pinch/prong/spike collars are not allowed while exhibiting Platinum Wethers.

Rule G1.

A buck must have 3 champion wins under at least two different judges. One of the required 3 wins may be received as a Junior buck. At least two of the required 3 wins must be received as a Senior buck. At least one of these wins must be at the age of 24 months or older. Effective 1/1/2023, all bucks are required to earn 2 of their 3 Grand Champion points under at least 2 different MGR certified judges towards their PGCH status. All Grand Champion points and PGCH titles earned prior to 1/1/2023 are valid.

Rule G2.

A doe must have 3 wins under at least two different judges. At least two of these wins must be received as a Senior doe. One of the required 3 wins may be received as a Junior doe. Effective 1/1/2023, all does are required to earn 2 of their 3 Grand Champion points under at least 2 different MGR certified judges towards their PGCH status. All Grand Champion points and PGCH titles earned prior to 1/1/2023 are valid.

****Examples for Rules G1. and G2.**

- A doe/buck has received 1 Grand Champion point under a non-MGR certified judge prior to 1/1/2023. The remaining 2 points must be earned under 2 different MGR certified judges.
- A doe/buck has received 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023. 1 was earned under a non-MGR certified judge and 1 was earned under a MGR certified judge. The 3rd and final point must be earned under a MGR certified judge and a different MGR certified judge than the other point was earned under.
- A doe/buck has received 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023. Both points earned were under 2 different MGR certified judges. The 3rd and final point can be earned under a non-MGR certified judge or another MGR certified judge (can be the same MGR judge who awarded one of the other 2 points).
- A doe/buck has received 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023. These points were earned under non-MGR certified judges. The 3rd and final point must be earned under a MGR certified judge.

Rule G3.

Effective 1/1/2023, Platinum Wethers must earn 2 of the 3 required Grand Champion points under 2 different MGR certified judges to qualify for Bronze level status. As noted above, for a Platinum Wether to earn Bronze level status, they must have received 3 Grand Champion points. To compete at the MGR National Show, Platinum Wethers must be at the Bronze level status or higher. If a Platinum Wether earns 2 of the 3 required Grand Champion points under non-MGR certified judges towards Bronze level status; they must continue to exhibit until 2 Grand Champion points are earned under 2 different MGR certified judges in order to compete at the MGR National Show (see example for Rule G3 below). All Grand Champion points and Platinum Wether levels earned prior to 1/1/2023 are valid.

****Examples for Rule G3.**

- A platinum wether earned 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023. 1 was earned under a MGR certified judge and 1 was earned under a non-MGR certified judge. The 3rd and final Grand Champion point towards Bronze level status and to qualify for competition at the MGR National Show, must be earned under a MGR certified judge; a different MGR judge than who awarded the previous point.
- A platinum wether earned 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023. Both points were earned under the same MGR certified judge. The 3rd and final Grand Champion point towards Bronze level status and to qualify for competition at the MGR National Show, must be earned under a MGR certified judge; a different MGR judge than who awarded one of the two previous points.
- A platinum wether earned 1 Grand Champion point prior to 1/1/2023 under a non-MGR certified judge. The final 2 points towards Bronze level status and to qualify for competition at the MGR National Show, must be earned under 2 different MGR certified judges.
- A platinum wether earned 2 Grand Champion points prior to 1/1/2023 under non-MGR certified judges (the same or two different judges). The 3rd and final Grand Champion point must be earned under a MGR certified judge to achieve Bronze level status. However, to qualify for competition at the MGR National Show as a Bronze level platinum wether; they must continue to exhibit until an additional Grand Champion point is achieved under a MGR certified judge (a different MGR certified judge than who awarded point 3).

Animal Identification

In the last newsletter, we looked at Animal Identification as it relates to the National Scrapie Eradication Program. We learned that goats leaving its herd are required to have Official ID although there are certain instances where exceptions apply. With that, we identified the types of Permanent ID that can be used. Those include tags, microchips and tattoo. In this article, we will revisit those forms of ID again and also learn how to apply these ID's to your goats. We will also learn how assigning a Permanent ID relates to registering with MGR.

Ear Tags

Ear tags are probably the most common form of ID that you will find. I think this is because it is one of the easiest forms to apply to your goats and also because USDA APHIS provides a limited number of free ear tags to first-time producers in the National Scrapie Eradication Program. Ear tags come in metal or plastic and also in different shapes and sizes.



The applicator will vary depending on what type of ear tags you are using.

Supplies Needed

- Ear tag applicator
- Ear Tags
- Rubbing alcohol
- A helper if desired

1) Squeeze the handles of the tagger to check that the pin slides easily into the hole on the opposite end of the tagger, to ensure that the halves of the tag will meet in proper alignment.



2) Restrain your goat kid by holding it allowing free access to the ear to be tagged. Older goats will require more constraint. A goat head chute or a grooming stand with head piece can be used for yearlings or adult goats.

3) Identify the area on the ear to be tagged. It doesn't matter which ear the tag is placed in. Be sure to go between the large veins in your goat's ears. The veins are located in the large creases in the ear.

4) Clean area identified for tagging with alcohol. Make sure your tag applicator and tags are cleaned as well. An old trick of the trade is using ice to numb the area to be pierced.

5) Position the ear tagger over the area you have selected and give it a strong squeeze.

6) Watch the animal over the next week for signs of infection associated with the ear tag. If severe pain, redness, or discharge develops, the tag may need to be removed and replaced at a later date after a course of antibiotic treatment and resolution of the infection.

Pro's

- Can be free to get started
- Easy to apply
- Accepted by all States' Dept of Ag
- Easy to read
- Multiple colors available for easy ID amongst sex of goats

Con's

- Ear can get infected even when using sanitary practices. I have had this happen and the tag had to be cut out and the ear now has a ripple to it.
- Tags can be ripped out on accident or easily removed by other people.

Tattoo

Tattooing is my preferred method of Permanent Animal ID. When we decided to switch from ear tags to tattoo, we made sure that our tattooing would be recognized for the National Scrapie Eradication Program. The herd suffix we use for registering our goats was registered as the Flock ID for use in tattooing. We place our herd suffix (Flock ID) in the right ear and the individual animal number in the left.

Some registries have a set of rules for its breeders to follow when tattooing. MGR does not have any specific rules for this form of ID. We chose to begin the animal number with the letter D (for our last name) and then assign a sequence of numbers. For the first kid we ever tattooed, we simply assigned 001. So the left ear tattoo read D001 and the right ear tattoo read ALK.

Holes are punctured under your goat's skin and then filled with ink. When the skin grows back over the holes the ink still shows through. A pattern of holes in the shape of a number or letter is punctured into the skin. Colored ink is worked into the holes and then the skin is allowed to grow over the ink, leaving a number or letter the color of the ink embedded in the animal's skin.

You must also purchase a series of metal digits or blocks that can be loaded into the pliers. Each block has a bunch of tiny metal spikes or pins sticking out from one side of it that form the shape of a number or letter. The pliers are clamped onto the hairless inside part of the goat's ear causing the tiny spikes to press into the skin and leave a pattern of holes in the shape of the numbers and letters. Either the small sized tattoo plier (also used for tattooing rabbits) or can be used on goats. The small sized tattooer is easier to fit in a goat kid's ear. However the tattoo will grow as the animal's ear grows bigger and some goat raisers feel the smaller tattoo "stretches" and becomes harder to read. If done right, your goat's tattoo will be readable for the rest of his/her life. However, you may need a flashlight to read a tattoo on a dark skinned goat.

You can purchase the pliers, letters and digits and tattoo ink online from different sources.

Supplies Needed

- Tattoo pliers
- Tattoo letters and digits
- Tattoo ink
- Toothbrushes
- Disposable gloves
- Rubbing alcohol
- Corn starch (this helps the ink set into the holes made in the ear better)
- A helper if desired
- Paper towels or cotton balls
- A couple sheets of blank paper
- List of tattoo's being assigned



1) Restrain the goat to begin the tattoo process. Some people use a disbudding box to place the goat in, especially if it is a kid getting the tattoo. You can also have a helper hold the goat while you tattoo. Older goats can be placed on a grooming stand using the headpiece to hold their head in place. I use a goat halter and tie them to the fence or a post.

2) Clean each ear where the tattoo will be placed using rubbing alcohol on a paper towel cotton balls.

3) Load the tattoo letters/digits into the pliers. I have 2 different pliers- 1 for the right ear (Flock ID) and 1 for the left ear (animal ID)

4) Test the pliers on your scratch paper to make sure letters/digits are loaded correctly.

5) Align the pliers into the ear (inside the ear) between the veins. Make sure you have the correct loaded pliers for the correct ear and that the tattoo wont be placed upside down (don't stand over top the goat while doing this).

6) Clamp the pliers with firm pressure, causing the spikes of the letters/digits to puncture into the skin.

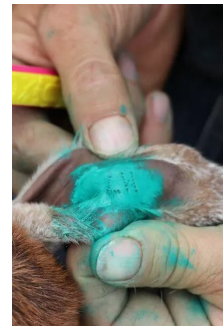
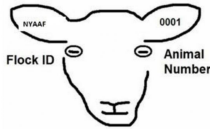
7) If you have a second pair of pliers, repeat step 6 for the other ear. If not, re-load the pliers and repeat step 6 for the other ear.

8) Application of ink: you can either use the tube (looks like a tooth paste tube), jar or roll-on ink. I prefer the jar and green ink. If using a tube or jar, load the bristles of the toothbrush with ink. Apply the ink to the inside of the ear, firmly applying pressure to the brush as you scrub the ink in the ear.

9) Repeat step 8 for the other ear.

10) If you choose to use the corn starch trick, get a small pinch of corn starch and sprinkle it over the ink and press it into the ink.

11) You are now ready for goat #2 if applicable.



Pro's

- Once applied, the tattoo can't be removed by someone else
- Pretty easy process to do
- All States recognize this form of ID
- Low cost after start up

Con's

- Can be a messy process!
- Tattoos can be hard to read especially in dark colored goats
- Tattoos can fade over time and become hard to read (I have not yet had a tattoo that I couldn't read using the flashlight trick)

Microchips

Using microchips is my other preferred method of animal ID. I do not assign every goat kid a microchip however. The kids we will be retaining are assigned a microchip and have this form of ID physically applied. With that said, any kid we retain are assigned two forms of ID- a tattoo and a microchip and are registered with both forms of ID. Any goat we purchase is also assigned a microchip. We like to have 2 forms of ID on all of our goats.

Microchips come in sterile, individual injectors that look like a large syringe and needle. Each is sealed, has a unique number, and includes several stick-on labels imprinted with the number. The microchips can be read only with a special microchip reader.

The best place to insert the microchip is in the tail web (the loose, hairless area under the tail on either side of the anus).

The 840 microchips are USDA APHIS approved for animal identification. The 840's are 15 digits long with the first 3 being the country code (840 for the United States). The 840's can only be used on animals born within the US.

Supplies Needed

- Microchips
- Microchip reader
- A helper if desired
- List of microchips being assigned
- Rubbing alcohol
- Paper towels or cotton balls



- 1) Restrain the goat to begin the chipping process. Some people use a helper to hold the goat still. You can also place the goat on a grooming stand if desired or tie to a gate/fence or post.
- 2) Clean the underside of the tail with rubbing alcohol.
- 3) Get the microchip ready. I use the SUDS (single use disposable syringe). The microchip is pre-loaded in the application needle.
- 4) Scan the microchip before applying to make sure it reads.
- 5) Lift up the goat's tail so the tail web is visible. Insert the syringe into/under the skin from the top down (vertical from the top towards the anus).
- 6) Push the plunger of the syringe to push the microchip out of the needle and into the tail web. At final placement, I like to have the microchip placed 3/4 of the way down the tail web. Remove the needle/syringe from the tail web.
- 7) Scan the tail web with your chip reader to confirm the microchip is reading.

**Pro's**

- Once applied, the chip can't easily be removed by someone else
- Pretty easy process to do
- Easy to read, scan and go!

Con's

- Is not recognized by Iowa as an accepted form of ID
- Microchips and chip reader are fairly expensive to buy
- Have heard of rare instances where the chip relocates from its inserted location and can't be located/read

Interested in becoming a certified MGR Judge? Are you between the ages of 18-21 and have aspirations for judging in the future? Are you a MGR member interested in fine tuning your knowledge of the MGR breed description and score cards? Now is your chance!

Attend the 2023 MGR Judges Certification, Youth Education and Audit to be held June 2, 2023 at the Myomania Show in Lebanon, Tennessee!

The Myotonic Goat Registry Judge's Certification Program will be a one-day event held in conjunction with the Myomania Show, in Lebanon, TN on Friday, June 2, 2023. It will be a long day, so we recommend you plan to arrive the evening before and stay the evening of the school. School will begin at 8:30 a.m. sharp.

We will begin with a one- or two-hour review of Myotonic goats & faults. You will be sent materials when you sign up for the school. This will include the Myotonic Goat Registry Breed Description, Official Sanctioned Show Rules, Judge's Rules and Conduct, Rules for Registration, etc. At the end of the review you will be given a written test covering the materials you have been sent along with a few questions which should be considered everyday knowledge. It will be a closed book test on the information that is sent to you.

The remainder of the day will be devoted to judging goats. We will focus on judging Myotonic goats as meat animals against the Myotonic Goat Registry Breed Description. You will judge as many classes as we have time and goats for. You will be expected to give reasons one-on-one to a trainer for two or three classes. You will receive a score for your placement of each class and for your reasons. If you achieve an average of 88% for the day you will become a Certified Myotonic Goat Registry Judge. MGR will hold the right to request any applicant scoring high enough to pass to work with an MGR Certified Judge during the weekend.

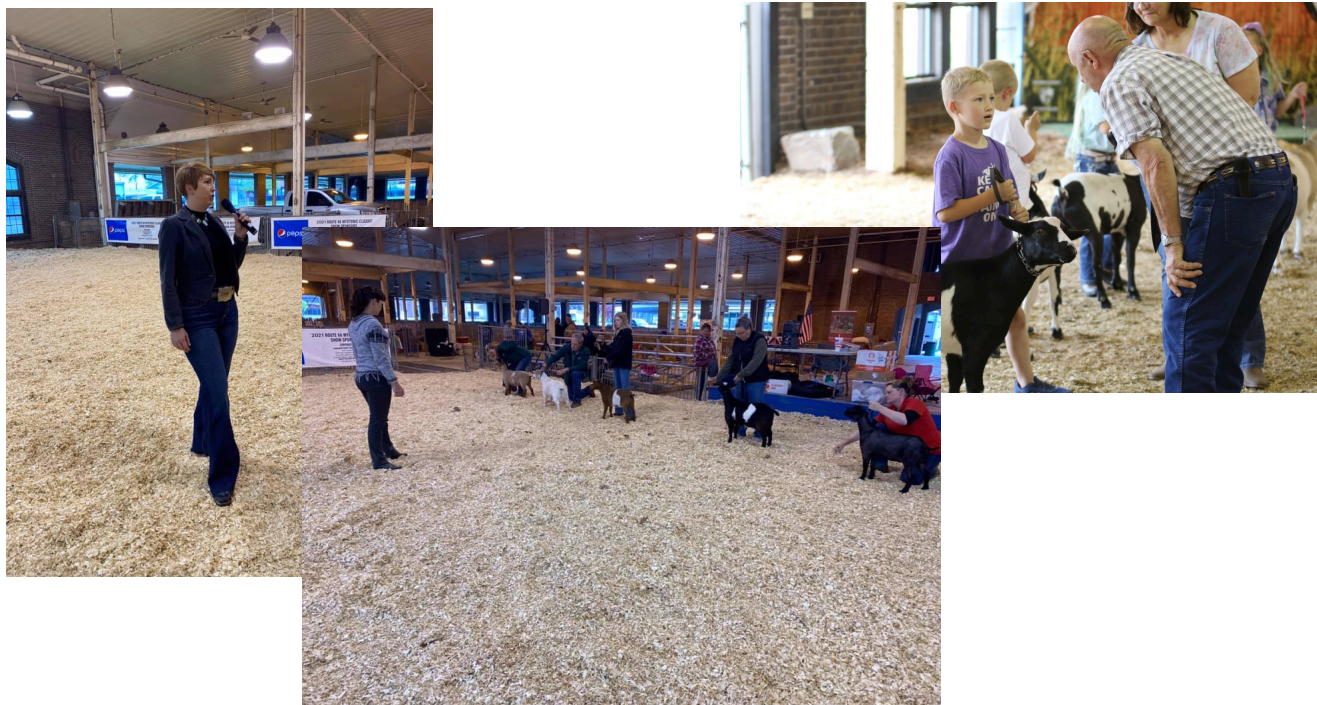
Given time and enough goats we may change up the format at the end of the day and judge a few classes in a group setting. The group will have ten minutes to place the class then someone will be volunteered to give their placement and reasons to the rest of the group. If another person has the class placed in a different order, they will be asked to give their placement and their reasons. This session will not be scored but it is a very good way to get some practice.

All applicants must be at least 18 years old & active breeders with the Myotonic Goat Registry. Applications must be received no later than April 8, 2022 and must include the \$300.00 judging school fee. Fees may be paid by personal check or money order. Applicants whom are not selected to attend will have their fees returned to them. Applicants who are selected but are unable to attend will not be given a refund for any reason nor will these fees be allowed to carry forward to a future school.

Applicants who are less than 21 years old may apply to participate in the MGR Youth Educational Seminar. Those participating in the youth educational seminar will take a written test (25 questions) on the MGR scorecards. Students must pass the written test to begin working with MGR judges. A list of MGR judges who are approved to work with students will be provided to passing youth at the seminar. Passing students will be given the opportunity to work with training judges both ringside & for several classes during shows. Our goal is for students to have the opportunity to learn to evaluate Myotonic goats under several MGR judges. The fee for the youth education course is \$150.00. Those students who advance and wish to test to become an MGR judge will then pay the remaining \$150.00 at 21 years old.

MGR will allow MGR breeders to attend as an audit only course. These spots will be limited and filled after youth spots have been filled. These spots will not take the written test or give oral reasons. Those applying will need to contact MGR via e-mail for approval. The fee is \$150.00 and written materials will be mailed to applicants.

Previous student who did not pass may reapply one time for a fee of \$100.00.

Fun Fact!

Originally known as Tuscarawa, residents changed the name of the town to Coshocton in 1811. The community grew slowly, even after the Ohio and Erie Canal reached the village. Thanks to the canal, Coshocton became a major commercial center in eastern Ohio during the 1820s and 1830s.

Coshocton has carried the nickname Crowtown for some time. No one seems to know exactly where the nickname came from but it is somehow linked to motorcycles. In 2008, when crows began to congregate in town in significant enough numbers to warrant propane cannons and pyrotechnics, the name began to fit like a glove.

Gaithersburg began in 1765 as a small agricultural settlement known as Log Town. In 1850, the post office was named "Forest Oak." The town officially became "Gaithersburg" when it was incorporated on April 5, 1878. A resolution was adopted giving it city status in the fall of 1968.

In the mid 1750s, Henry B. Brookes amassed a large plantation of more than 1,000 acres. His son-in-law, Benjamin Gaither, settled on his wife's dower property near the intersection of present-day Diamond and Frederick Avenues before 1800. Gaither started a blacksmith shop, store, and tavern to serve travelers and locals. His crossroads enterprise became known as Gaithersburg.

Fun Fact!

The settlers living in the area that is now Litchfield, named their settlement Ness on April 5, 1858, after many of the first settlers' home - the parish of Næs in the traditional region of Hallingdal, Norway.

Litchfield got its name from a man named Electus Bachus Darwin Litchfield. He was a contractor, an investor, and a stockholder in the St. Paul and Pacific Railroad which originally went from St. Paul to St. Cloud and was built from 1862 to 1864.[8] Later, his investments provided the means for building a more southern line through Meeker County to Breckenridge.

Village of Litchfield was originally called several different names including Round Lake, Ripley, and finally Ness. Litchfield was originally a portion of a congressional township named Round Lake, but most people called it Ripley after Ripley Lake one mile from its center.

The people of Ness were permitted to vote on the actual chartered village name of their township. Electus Litchfield donated grants of \$2000 each to various religious sects in town to build churches, the Episcopal and Presbyterian churches being two of them. The Presbyterian Church, Litchfield's first church, was built in 1870.

The majority of the 350 people voted for the name Litchfield over Ness and the township of Litchfield was chartered as a village on February 29, 1872. The first village council meeting was held on April 5, 1872, in the railroad's land office. Jesse Vawter Branham, Jr. was elected the President of the Council.

She has been very active in clubs and organizations and has held many leadership positions and won numerous awards and accolades; including the National FFA Organization, Warren County 4-H, the Iowa Meat Goat Association, American International Charolais Association and the Midwest Mini Rex Club.

How has raising Myotonic goats impacted your life? Raising myotonic goats has impacted my life in such great and positive ways. I have been able to raise livestock while learning how to be financially responsible, grow as a leader, and learn life skills that will help me forever. Raising myotonic goats has been the best experience for me as it has prepared me for everyday situations to life decisions. I am able to run a herd of goats responsibly because I have learned how to manage my farm. I feel that I am more financially responsible because I have to make sure my animals have the proper care and needs to make them healthy. Making financial decisions on behalf of my herd will help my long term.

I have also grown individually as a person because of raising Myotonic goats. Growing up I was very shy but when I was in a showring or with my goats I am in my happy place where I shine and just seem to be more confident. Raising myotonic goats has given me the opportunity to gain confidence in myself by showing and talking to customers. This last year I was even able to judge a county fair myotonic goat show, which was something that I dreamed of doing. My future goal is to be a certified Myotonic goat judge while still owning and raising goats. I have a future because of myotonic goats; one that I am very excited for. Raising myotonic goats is more than just breeding and selling goats to me. It is a way of life that I am proud of. One that I love sharing with others so they can be aware of this great breed of goats that has helped me in life.





What advice would you have for beginning MGR youth breeders? My advice for beginning MGR youth breeders is to ask questions and watch experienced breeders. I have been fortunate to learn from so many great breeders and without those experiences I would not be confident in my breeding and goat skills. Building relationships with others is critical for breeders to be better. I don't know how many times I have called upon an experienced breeder for advice. They are beyond beneficial for others to have. I would also suggest to build a relationship with a veterinarian. I have been fortunate not to have to use a veterinarian often, but when they are needed, they are needed. Having a relationship is nice to have so it helps with providing needs to your goats. They too have such a wealth of knowledge that a person can tap into. I have been fortunate to have a vet near me that is helpful with my goats. He may not be fluent in small ruminant animals, but he is also very willing to learn and look into things. I think that is very helpful and beneficial. Building relationships has helped me a great deal and I would hope youth breeders could benefit from them, as well. I know that when I sell to a youth breeder, I try my best to answer any questions they have before and after purchasing.
