"Blister beetle" poisoning may occur when one of the various species of blister beetles are ingested by livestock. The beetles are found primarily in alfalfa, and tend to swarm when the crop is in full bloom. If the alfalfa is harvested at this time, the beetles can be trapped in the bales and contaminate the crop. Even small parts of the beetle are toxic. As little as 4-6 grams may be fatal to an 1100 pound horse.1 If possible, you should avoid cutting hay in the areas of the field where blister beetles are present. Once the beetles leave, these areas can be harvested. Since blister beetles usually don't emerge until late May/June in the southwest USA, the first cutting is generally free of blister beetles, and by the same token, the last cutting is usually safe because the adult blister beetles are no longer active.3

This type of poisoning occurs mostly in horses, but can occur in cattle, sheep, and goats. In addition, it can also occur in people, dogs, cats, rabbits and rats.3 Blister beetles do not spread their toxin by biting. The beetles contain a substance called cantharidin. This toxic chemical causes blistering and necrosis of any mucous membranes it may be in contact with. When the beetles are mating, the male secretes this colorless, odorless toxin for the female to use to cover her eggs for protection against predators.4 How the cantharidin is produced by the beetle is not known. Cantharidin levels are not affected by curing the hay, and even if using hay that was harvested years previously, the toxin is still present.1

If ingested by livestock, the tissues most often affected are the gastrointestinal mucosa including the mouth, renal or bladder tissue and the heart muscle.2 Symptoms may include salivation and anorexia (from blisters and erosions of mouth and tongue), colic (from mucosal damage), urinary infection and blood in the urine (from bladder or urethral mucosal damage), dehydration, endotoxic shock and death. There is no antidote or treatment other than supportive therapy with intravenous fluid to combat the dehydration and shock. Giving mineral oil via a nasogastric tube can help clear the toxin from the gastrointestinal tract, and activated charcoal via the tube may help if given early enough.3

I would like to remind all breeders that MGR has a Yahoo group and a Facebook group along with a Facebook Myotonic Goats For Sale group. If you would like to be added to any of the groups please e-mail me at:

All youth breeders are welcome to be part of the groups but must have a parent or legal guardian added along with them. It is our goal to offer the safest possible environment for our youth.

On December 31, 2012 our registry closed to bucks. All bucks registered must be out of (2) MGR registered parents. Non-registered reference goats in our database or goats registered with any other registry does NOT constitute MGR registered parents. Please be sure to check the paperwork on any bucks you intend to purchase as this will affect your ability to register kids.

The 2013 National show & Judges school is currently in the planning stages and hopefully will be ready to announce shortly. The expected time will be the second weekend in November. Please be sure to check the MGR website for updates.

Each spring the registry becomes extremely busy with new kid registrations. I am asking everyone to submit their kid registrations as early as they possibly can. My goal is to offer the best possible service to every breeder but that also means everyone must submit timely registration applications. Waiting until a week before your kids are ready to sell or a buyer is standing in front of you does not offer your buyers good service. I receive many calls during the year from upset buyers who were promised a registration certificate on a goat they purchased only to never receive them. If you are buying registered goats then refuse to make the purchase without the papers in hand. There is nothing MGR can do to provide you with a registration certificate after the fact! NOTICE OF CHANGE

Looking to the future of the breed is very important not only for its preservation but also for the acceptance of the Myotonic as a breed. One of the ongoing problems in that acceptance is that as a landrace breed it has many different looks, and therefore cannot be given a breed standard that will cover the breed. This is the reason MGR has in the past only used a Breed Description.

How do we get this to be an accepted breed by the industry and also be able to have a breed standard that will indeed allow for a true conformation? Not a simple or quick task to do. However, we will begin on 01/01/2013 to initiate our first step by closing the registry to allow only bucks that have two (2) registered MGR parents.

How does this help? We must accept that our Bucks are one half of our herd. Therefore, if no new bucks are allowed into the MGR registry then we will begin to see a particular look begin to shape within this registry. This will not happen overnight but is a start to progressively moving the Myotonics into a breed that can be recognized instantly by breeders.

Remember: as of 01/01/2013 Bucks without TWO registered MGR parents will not be allowed to be registered---no exceptions.

THE GOURMET GOAT: ASPARAGUS & TUNA NOODLE CASSEROLE

Recipe courtesy of Meyenberg Goat Milk Products

Ingredients:

1 lb. fresh asparagus, or 1 package (10 oz.) frozen asparagus cuts and tips

1/2 cup boiling water

3 Tablespoons butter or margarine

3 Tablespoons all purpose flour

1 1/2 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

1 1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce

12 oz. MEYENBERG Evaporated Goat Milk

1 can (6 1/2 oz.) tuna, drained

3 cups cooked shell noodles

3/4 cup sliced ripe olives

2 cups (8 oz.) grated cheddar cheese, divided usage

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Clean and cut fresh asparagus into 1 to 2 inch pieces. In large saucepan, cook asparagus in boiling water until tender. Stir in butter. Set aside. In small mixing bowl, combine flour, salt, mustard and Worcestershire sauce. Gradually stir in evaporated goat milk. Mix until smooth. Pour milk mixture over asparagus. Cook and stir until mixture thickens. Stir in tuna, noodles, olives and 1 cup of cheese. Pour into shallow greased two quart baking dish. Sprinkle remaining cup of cheese over top. Bake 20-25 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Serve hot. Makes six 1-cup servings.

WEAK KID SYNDROME

My hope is that my experience will help someone else and save some babies. A couple of days ago I went out in the morning to feed the goats and found a 3 week old buckling totally limp in the barn. He is a triplet that I have been supplementing twice a day to avoid a bottle baby. The temperature in the night here was in the 20s. I immediately brought him into the house and the first thing I thought of was to get some warm milk in him but he was so weak he could not suck. I was about to tube him and did not see him breathing. So I walked away thinking we lost him and thought there was nothing I could do. After a couple of minutes I walked by him to go back outside and finish my chores. When I did I thought I saw him breathe. So I decided to go ahead and tube him. Luckily I had bought a weak kid syringe with tube a couple of weeks before. I have never had to tube a goat before and didn't have time to go read instructions. All I could remember was to put the tube in the left side of his mouth. After I tubed him, I put him on a heating pad on a low setting with a towel over it. Then I went online a looked up weak kid syndrome on www.tenneeseemeatgoats.com. I then took his temperature and it wouldn't even register on the thermometer. I followed what the article said and immediately put him in warm water. In the mean time I injected warm lactated ringers under the skin. I gave him 60ccs (30ccs subcutaneously in each of side of his shoulders). I then tubed him again with a couple of ounces of warm water with molasses. I continued the warm water bath until his temperature reached 100 degrees. I didn't realize until I read the article that babies that have a body temperature below 100 degrees cannot

digest milk. So I don't know if that helped him or not but it was my first reaction. I gave him 1cc each of B12 and B Complex. Once his temperature reached the 100 degrees, I dried him off with a blow dryer and placed him on a heating pad again. The heating pad was on a low setting a covered with a towel. I kept checking on him and eventually he was started to cry out. After about 3 hours of the whole ordeal, I walked into the room where he was and he was standing up on the other side of the room and cried out to me. I then fixed him a bottle of milk and he took it all. I was shocked. I couldn't believe it. I really thought he was dead. I would never wish this experience on anyone. I do hope that if you have to go thru it that my experience helps you. His name is K&B Ranch Second "Chance".




