Rules & Regulations

1. All goats entered must be registered with Myotonic Goat Registry The original registration MUST accompany the goat during check-in. Kids under three months of age must be registered for any sanctioned class that they will be shown in.
2. Junior and Senior Buck, Doe & Wether classes will be shown and sanctioned using the Myotonic Goat Registry sanctioning regulations.
3. The base date for computing the animal's age will be the date of the show and will be determined by the registration certificate.
4. Goats must be checked in before 4:00PM the evening before the show. If the goat is showing both days, only one check-in is necessary on the evening before the show.
5. Goats showing on only Saturday March 20th only will be released at 9PM after the show. Goats showing on Sunday March 21 will be released one hour after the show is finished.
6. Show Secretary reserves the right to split large classes.
7. Shows will start promptly at the given time each day.
8. Out of state exhibitors must have interstate health papers for March 2010, dated no more than 30 days prior to the show. PA exhibitors must have health papers dated no more than 30 days prior to the show. No tests are required, just a veterinarian's statement that the herd is healthy and free of communicable diseases. A valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed by an accredited veterinarian must accompany all animals. The Veterinarian will be checking animals In.
9. Any animal appearing in poor health or displaying abscesses, or obvious signs of soremouth or pinkeye may not be shown. The show committee shall have the authority to request the removal of such an animal.
10. These are points & ribbons shows. Any premiums awarded will be announced at the shows.
12. To be eligible for regular entry fees, entry fees must be postmarked Feb 28, 2010
And 8.00 per entry per show must accompany entry form. Entries will be accepted until March 19th at 3:00PM in person. The fee for entries after March 19th is double.
13. Pen fees will be \$8.00 per pen needed. This fee is a one time fee for either or both days. Pens will be marked according to postmark on entry envelope unless the exhibitor is physically handicapped. Those persons will be placed as near the ring area as possible. You must give notice if you are handicapped.
14. Entries must be made on printed entry forms furnished by Myotonic Goat Registry. All information & signatures asked for on the entry form must be furnished or the entries will be rejected.
15. Substitutions may be made within the classes offered.
16. There will be a ten minute limit between classes for exhibitors to have their animals in the ring for judging. This will be strictly adhered to.
17. All Greater Reading Expo Center Rules must be abided by within the compounds of the fair.

- Class 3) Sr. Doe Kid: 6 to 9 months of age**
- Class 4) Advanced Doe Kid: 9 to 12 months of age**
- Class 5) Yearling Doe: Unfreshened 12 to 24 months of age**

Junior Champion & Reserve Junior Champion Doe
(Selected from the 1st and 2nd place animals in classes 1-5)

Senior Doe Classes

- Class 6) Yearling Doe Sr.: Freshened 12 to 24 months of age**
- Class 7) Two Year Old Doe: 24 to 36 months of age**
- Class 8) Three Year Old: 36 to 48 months of age**
- Class 9) Four Year Old and Older: 48 months and over**
- Class 10) Mini-Does: Does that have been certified as Mini**
