

Youth Bred & Owned Explanation of Rules

Youth bred and owed classes are defined as -the goat must be owned by the youth member at the time of breeding. A goat cannot be transferred while pregnant to the youth and the offspring show in youth bred and owed. Offspring must hold youth members herd name.

Rules

- 1. If you enter in youth bred and owned, you must also enter the goat in the sanctioned classes (show). The goat is not required to be shown and may be scratched. The reason for this is the youth bred and owned (also showmanship) are not sanction classes, so they are free to the kids when their goat is entered in the regular sanction show.
- 2. The child must be the owner and breeder on the MGR registration for them to participate.
- 3. Only purebred Myotonic goats are to be entered in youth bred and owned NO Percentages are allowed.
- 4. The child must be present to participate in youth bred and owned and show their goats. If the child has more than one goat in a class, they may have additional handlers.
- 5. No prong collars may be used in youth bred and owned classes.
- 6. All goats in youth bred and owned must be 12 months old or less. The date of birth will be confirmed by the MGR registration certificate.
- 7. Absolutely NO rough treatment of any goat will be tolerated. Hitting slapping or kicking any goat will result of an automatic disqualification and excused from the ring.
- 8. NO bracing of goats is allowed. Goats should stand squarely and evenly with all four feet on the ground.
- 9. The youth bred and owned classes are judged using the Myotonic Goat Registry score cards. All sanction rules will apply to youth bred and owned classes.
