MENTOR, MENTEE, MENTORSHIP: PAYING IT FORWARD TO PROSPER MUTUALLY

The MGR is here to preserve Myotonics, this fabulous breed of goat that we all, as breeders, love so dearly. The efforts to perform this task are vast and multi-directional and one of the best programs in place to preserve the breed is mentorship.

Mentorship is known to provide support, growth, encouragement, feedback, knowledge and information for free to mentees. It serves as a support system for the mentee in so many ways, from learning to navigate registration paperwork as well as other MGR documents in putting your work order packets together, to obtaining basic goat husbandry information to ensure a healthy herd and expanding on to biosecurity measures and learning what it means to cull within your herd and then going further into advertising how-tos for sales and promotion and advancing in knowledge for the show ring and for commercial herds. The MGR Mentorship Program is just limitless for growth and learning.

Did you know that this wonderful program serves as a benefit to the mentor as well? What does a mentor stand to gain you ask? A mentor strengthens their own knowledge, grows a network of connections, advances their leadership skills, helps gain a new perspective and provides a sense of fulfillment as they give back, just as those before them gave to them. It keeps you on your toes as a mentor so that you continue to grow in your knowledge as you network with other breeders about various subjects to ascertain answers to questions that you yourself may not have been met with during your experiences. Why are both of these pieces so important? They are so important because through mentorship we all grow, we all learn, and we all prosper, and when we as breeders prosper then the breed prospers.

Welcoming new members and breeders with kindness and open arms helps to empower them, educate them and get them off to a good strong start providing a solid foundation on which they can build and grow. - Help Identify Goals & Assess Current Reality
- Provide Feedback Respectfully & with Kindness
- Have a Willingness to seek Higher Knowledge

The Myotonic Goat Registry was formed in 2005 as a sole ownership registry by Gene McNutt with input from an initial Board of Advisors made up of Dr. Phil Sponenberg and Barbara Roberts. The current Board of Advisors includes Dr.Phil Sponenberg, Cindy Bene, Eve Williams and Anna Garrett. The owner and Board of Advisors will make decisions concerning the registry and its procedures. This method of governance is meant to provide Myotonic Goat breeders with a registry that will not have frequent changes, and will have the longevity and consistency needed to successfully promote the Myotonic Goat breed, while at the same time make it responsive to the needs and wishes of the breeders. In 2009, Gene retired and the registry was sold to Tara Lawrence. As the Myotonic Goat Registry grows, additional Board of Advisor members may be added in order to more broadly represent the breeders. The owner, along with the Board of Advisors, will be responsible for providing for its own replacements and/or expansions.

The Myotonic Goat Registry takes into consideration all breeders, from pet owners to commercial meat growers. Regardless of which aspect of this breed appeals to you, the Myotonic Goat Registry is the place for all breeders to register their Myotonic Goats.

The Registry will help breeders promote their goats through sales, shows, and advertising, and will educate the public about the Myotonic Goat and its usefulness in a variety of settings.
